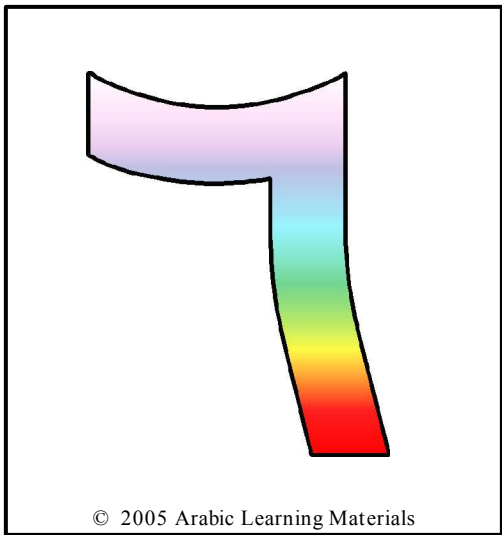
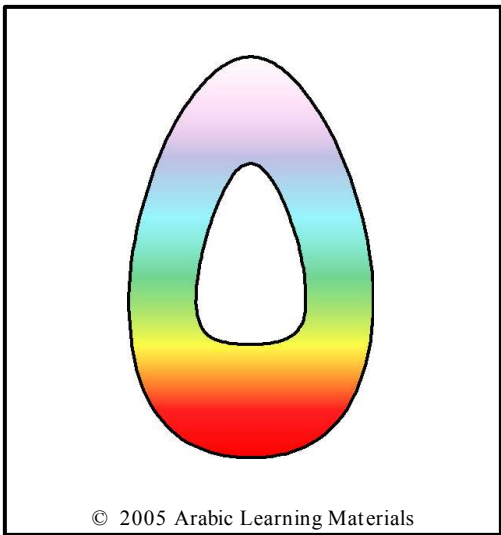
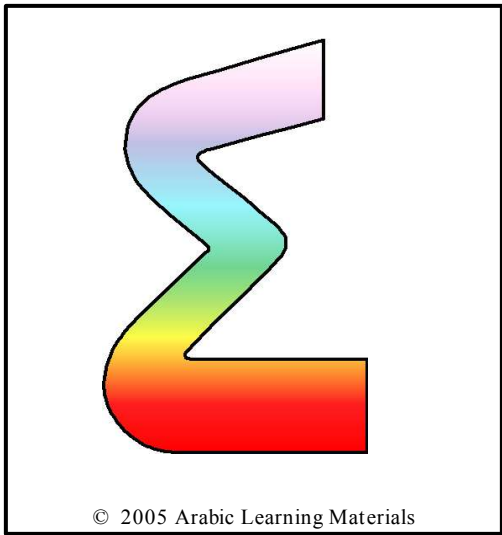
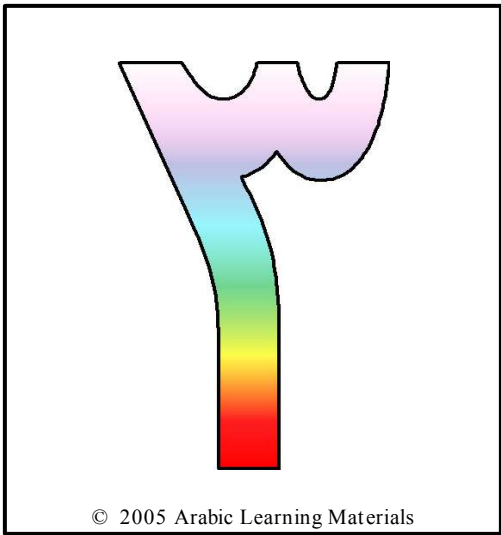
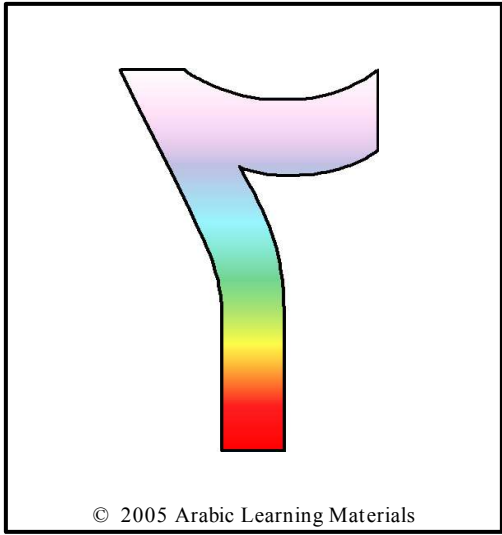
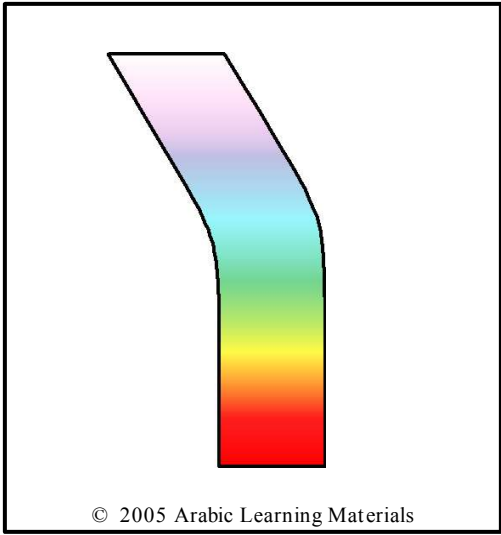
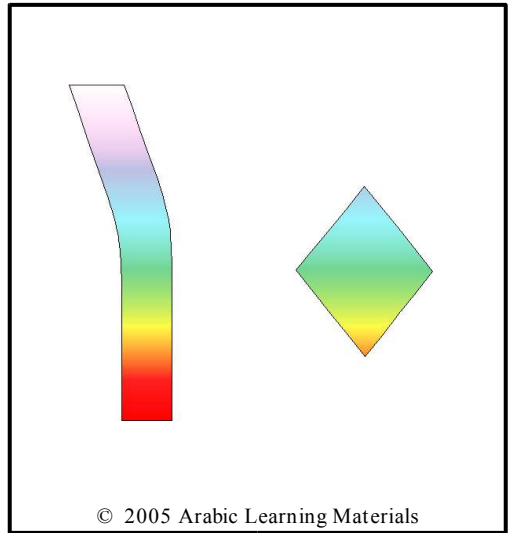
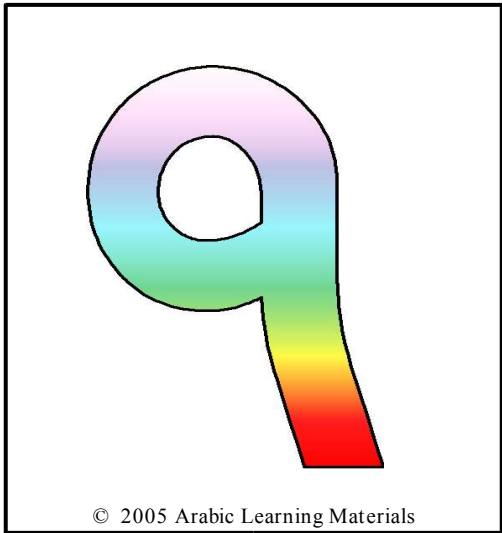
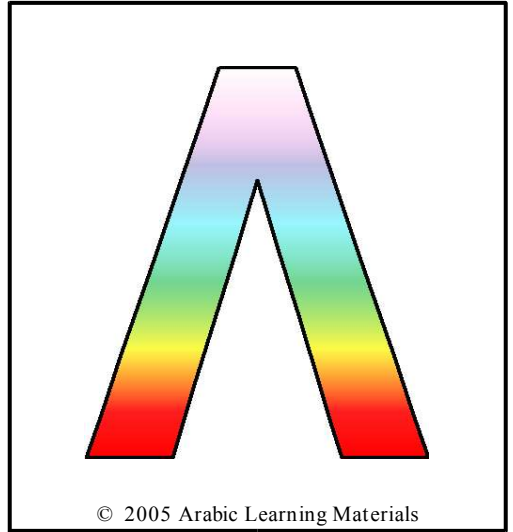
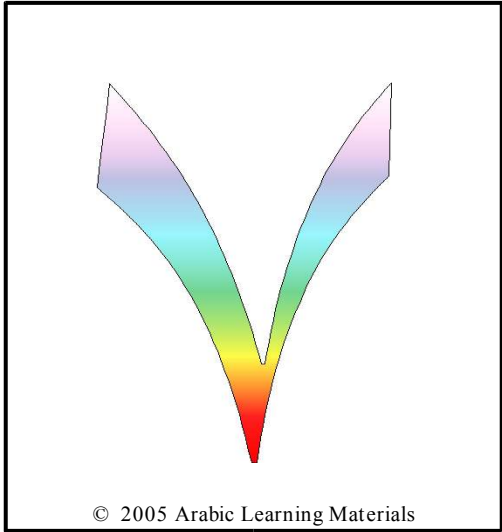


Arabic Number Matching Game




HOW TO USE THIS FILE:

- Open the document. Print two copies of the number pages.
- If you choose to print in black and white, select your printer to print all pages in black and white and then color in all the pages. I preferred to print the pages on cardstock and then laminated them prior to cutting out the pieces.
- Cut out all the pieces of the Arabic Number Sheets.
- Use these sheets for a matching game. Simply lay down all the cards face down. Have your child turn over (one at a time) two cards each time. If they find a pair, set them aside. If not, turn the cards over again and pick another two cards. Your child must try to find the pairs of each number.
- To improve recognition of the Arabic numbers, tell your child what number has been turned over each time.
